

THE VINE PRE-SCHOOL



Pre-School Pupil Premium January 2015–July 2015

Cambridgeshire is one of small number of local authorities piloting the new Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP) one term early. The EYPP is designed to narrow the attainment gap between young children from low-income families and their peers. All children aged 3 and 4 who meet the eligibility criteria will benefit from the funding. It will be paid to early years providers on an hourly rate basis, linked to claimed hours for eligible children. The annual value for a 15 hour place over a full year will be just over £300.

Any provider registered to offer funded early years places will receive the EYPP if they have entitled children. Parents need to agree to their entitlement being verified by the local authority from January 2015.
